STORMTROOPERS IN STILETTOS EXHIBITION

1977-1982: EXCESS ALL AREAS

'40 Years of Glam Rocking Genius' NME 14th March 2001 'Britain's Best Loved Band' The Sun 25th February 2011 Between 1977 and 1982 Queen officially became the most successful band in the world, releasing some of the biggest and best songs of all time including 'Tie Your Mother Down', 'Good Old Fashioned Lover Boy', 'We Are The Champions', 'We Will Rock You', 'Fat Bottomed Girls', 'Bicycle Race', 'Don't Stop Me Now', 'Crazy Little Thing Called Love', 'Save Me', 'Play The Game', 'Another One Bites The Dust', 'Flash' and 'Under Pressure' featuring David Bowie. Now Island Records reissue the five Queen albums from this period on June 27th 2011 as part of the band's 40th

Anniversary celebrations — 'News of the World', 'Jazz', 'The Game', 'Flash Gordon' and 'Hot Space'. The reissues will be accompanied by the second in the 'Queen: Deep Cuts' series, which looks at some of the lesser-known tracks from these albums.



These five albums were re-

corded as Queen's UK stadium success spread to the USA, South America, Europe and Asia and are the sound of a band breaking through the crash barriers of their own limitless ambition. The early 80's saw the band conquer South America for the first time, creating rock history when they played at the Morumbi Stadium in Brazil to 131,000 people - then the largest paying audience for a single band anywhere in the world.

If the early 70's and the first five albums Queens released represented the band's hard-rocking years, then the late 70's and early 80's represented their hard partying era. As Brian, Roger, Freddie and John toured the world their reputation for off-stage rock'n'roll extravagance grew with stories of legendary party excess from Kensington to Copacabana informing the Queen mythology.

The Queen image changed too in the second half of the 70s. Infamously Sid Vicious bumped into Freddie Mercury at Wessex Studios where both Pistols and Queen are recording - 'Ullo Fred - I see you've bought ballet to the masses then!' Says Sid, eyeing up Freddie's legendary ballet pumps. 'Ah Mr Ferocious. Yes, doing my best dear' retorted Freddie. It was also during this period that one of the most iconic images in contemporary music was developed, when in 1980 Freddie Mercury grew perhaps the most famous moustache of modern times! Inspired by his adventures in the Lower East Side New York nightlife of the late 70's, the moustache and attendant leathers completely reinvented

the band's look. Famously the moustache caused outrage among many fans who mailed him disposable razors.

Queens 40th Anniversary year has kicked off in spectacular style so far with their first ever major exhibition 'Stormtroopers in Stilettos' in London's East End which drew an incredible crowd of over 20,000 visitors in two weeks, and kicked off with a star studded launch party attended by the likes of Foo Fighters and Jessie J. The Sun advised 'Get down there, it's an impressive collection'. Meanwhile the bands first five albums have been reissued to considerable acclaim. The Telegraph said of their early work, 'Queen's greatest music was extravagantly innovative, technically brilliant and created with a jeweler's care.'

These five albums highlight the diverse talent, musical ambition and already global success of a band made up of some of the best songwriters, musicians and performers of all time.



CHRISTIANI AWARD

On April 23rd, Brian received the Eddy Christiani Award in The Netherlands for his contribution to Pop Music and Guitars. Eddy Christiani was he man who was so very important in Holland and Europe with his special electric guitar sound. He was the first man to play an electric guitar with amplifiers, which lead the way for the next generations of guitar players, like the winners of the prize, Ad Vanden-

berg winner 2008 Jan Akkerman winner 2009 (of the group Focus, Steve Lukather, winner 2010 and of course Brian, winner 2011.

Many top Dutch artists attended the event, and Brian took to the stage with some of them after being handed his award. (Story elsewhere in this issue!) Brian said: "I'm very honoured. I'm very honoured. See, deep down I don't think I'm that clever, you know. There are plenty people who can play much more technically and certainly much faster than me, and who are very innovative. I just play what I feel if I can. That's my aim and I'm just happy to be in the company. I don't feel like I'm better than anybody else. I'm just happy that people wanna hear what I do. This is a great sign of that. People have been very kind to me today, saying that they listened to me and they were influenced by me and, you know, in the same way as I was influenced by my heroes, so it's a nice river to be part of."



BRIAN AND KERRY ELLIS

As you will all know Brian worked with Kerry on her stunning "Anthems" album, and they decided to take the album on the road! They started out with a charity concert in London's Royal Albert Hall, and covered 14 dates across the UK, including Hampton Court and a special concert for the RAF Benevolent Fund, at RAF Cranwell, in Lincolnshire on July 16th. Brian was particularly happy to perform at this event, as he said when speaking to a local Lincolnshire newspaper: "My dad Harold was a radio operator and navigator. He flew Beaufighters and Mosquitos. He met my mum, Ruth Fletcher in the RAF, she was a dental orderly in the WRAF and I believe it was at Cranwell that they met". The tour brought in rave reviews for Kerry's vocal ability and, of course, Brian's musical genius! Let's hope this collaboration continues!!

WE WILL ROCK YOU

As it celebrates it's 9th anniversary, the fabulous We Will Rock You has finally scooped the coveted Olivier Award! They won the prestigious BBC Radio 2 "Audience Award" this year. Roger and Brian were in attendance at the 9th Anniversary show on May 31st, (Brian emerging form the trapdoor in a cloud of smoke and taking an already ecstatic



audience up a notch as he thundered into the Bo Rhap solo!) and were proud to show off their award on stage! The show continues to wow audiences in London night after night, and it has just been announced that booking will be extended to March 2012!! The touring show was a sell out at every venue. It was also featured on a British stamp along with a series of other West End musical shows.

BRIAN COLLABORATIONS



Brian has played on the Steve Cropper album "Dedicated" released on August 9th. Brian plays on the rocking track "I Do". His press release is quoted as follows: "Dedicated features an all-star cast of famous friends including Steve Winwood, Brian May, B.B. King, Lucinda Williams and Buddy Miller. It's a tribute

to Lowman Pete Pauling and his band The 5 Royales. Eric Clapton and James Brown also have cited The 5 Royales as a key influence.

Cropper, during his time as in-house guitarist for the Stax label, is credited with writing some true R&B classics: "Knock on Wood," "In the Midnight Hour" and "(Sittin' On) The Dock of the Bay." His rhythm guitar skills have been acclaimed for 40 years."

Brian also features on Lady Ga Ga"s number one hit album "Born This Way". He is on the track "You & I". A press source said of the Mutt Lange produced track: "Featuring Queen's Brian May on guitar (credited



as Dr. Brian May) along with a sample of the band's "We Will Rock You," the studio version, which Lange worked on from his recording complex in Switzerland, emotes a sense of grandness that listeners don't always get with Gaga's RedOne-produced heavily-synthetic sounds. To the contrary, a live piano and background vocals by Gaga and Lange add an undeniably lush quality, while the lyrics, which tell of a passionate love affair with a "Nebraska guy" and feature umlauts over every letter "u," drive the song home and potentially into hit territory".

SONGS FOR JAPAN

Queen donated their track "Teo Torriate" to this album, to raise much needed funds to help the people of Japan after the earthquake and tsunami. The album features 36 tracks by many artistses, and is available online through Amazon or at your record stores.

QUEEN INFLUENCES...

My Chemical Romance's **Gerard Way** has said he plans to channel Freddie Mercury during the band's Reading And

Leeds Festivals shows this year. The singer was speaking in the new issue of NME, on UK newsstands now or digitally. Way said the band took inspiration from Queen singer Mercury after being bottled during their 2006 appearance at Reading Festival.



"I said to the guys, 'I never

want to play this again until we headline'," be said. "Kind of what Freddie Mercury once said when Queen were booed offstage at this festival [they were booed off stage at a show in Australia, at the Sunbury Festival in 1974."

Dave Grohl, from the Foo Fighters, also quotes Queen as a major influence:

"The key to success in any venue, Grobl says, is "breaking down that barrier" between fans and the band.



Asked for an example, he says, "The bands that get up on stage and play like it's the last night of their lives are the ones I have a lot of respect for." But he takes the time to cite three particular performers who he says made performing in front of huge crowds into their own art

forms: Freddie Mercury, Paul McCartney and Bruce Springsteen.

"Every band should study Queen at Live Aid," he says.
"If you really feel like that barrier is gone, you become
Freddie Mercury. I consider him the greatest frontman
of all time. Like, it's funny – you'd imagine that Freddie

was more than human, but ... You know how be controlled Wembley Stadium at Live Aid in 1985? He stood up there and did his vocal warm ups with the audience. Something that intimate, where they realize, 'Oh yeah, be's just a f***ing dude.'"

NEW QUEEN DOCUMENTARY

A brand new Queen documentary was aired on BBC2 here in the UK on The 29th and 30th May. Made by Queen fans Rhys Thomas and Simon Lupton, it featured loads of previously unseen footage, new interviews and in depth answers from Brian and Roger about their past. It gave a new insight into how the band members viewed their past successes, excesses, and occasional failures. In all a fabulous, condensed look at the band's 40 years together. It was, and will be repeated I am sure, check out the BBC website at http://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer. In an online interview (The Quietus - www.thequietus.com) Rhys said of his love of Queen: "One of the first gigs I went to, when I was 12, was the Freddie Mercury tribute at Wembley Stadium - not because I was into Queen, it was more to see George Michael, embarrassingly. But I came away from it thinking these were some of the best songs I'd ever heard, and the obsession took hold. Over the next four years I bought every album and single in the back catalogue, saving up my pocket money. I don't think I bought any other records bet-



ween the ages of 12 and 16." He was asked if he was therefore the "un-hippest" kid in the playground: "I was, actually, but I didn't really care. In fact, I used to try and convert people by playing them tracks which weren't like the typical Queen hits they'd already heard; things like 'Stone Cold Crazy' from Sheer Heart Attack, or 'Fight From The Inside' from News Of The World." In this interview Rhys also commented: "I think both Brian and Roger are on great form in the new interviews. They really opened up for us, speaking more candidly than at any time in their past. There's more that we couldn't fit into the two one-hour programmes that are being broadcast, so we might end up doing an extended cut for DVD at a later date."



WEWILL ROCK

The We Will Rock You Premiere in Norway, by Hans Olav Bakken

hursday January 27. was a historical day in Norway. At half past seven that night the norwegian Premiere of «We will rock you» was underway.

Actually it was underway twice, since the screen showing the historical music-events trough time didn't work the first time, meaning that Pop — in Norway called «Oddie» or Odd Børretzen, an eldery very respected artist - would have to postpone his searchlight-dodging a couple of minutes until the screens where fixed and the audience actually could read the screens - including a pretty good bashing of Norways biggest international musical act, A-ha, and their many farewell-tours - on the second try.

wegian. That songs are Radio Gaga, Scharamouche's part of I want to break free, Killer Queen, Play The Game and the first half of One Vision. With the exection of Schara's I want to break free-part I personaly think that this actually works quite well, despite me being quite skeptical beforehand.

Much of the reason this is working I credit to Reidun Sæther as Killer Queen. Her absolutly stunning voice makes the songs impressive even in norwegian, and thank god for that, giving that the norwegian lyrics really aren't that impressive. The norwegian lyrics is also the reason as to why I don't like Schara's I want to break free. The lyrics actually makes the majestic song sound quite shallow and superficial, and the fact that

Killer Queen and Khashoggi, on the other hand, is hung up by the fact that - for the sake of the concept made able to work in Norway, I guess — English is a forbidden and deciced language and that ever since the Norwegian currency passed the USD in value, the whole world — now known as Planet eBay, of course — is speaking Norwegian. A fact that is corroborated by five songs, partly or entirely, in the show being sung in Nor-

Mari Haugen Smistad sings it in her native dialect really, really doesn't make it any better (And that's comming form a man with the same dialect)! Too bad, couse Mari's voice and empathy is not far of from Reidun Sæther's. You can cleary tell that they both, like Espen Grjotheim, is great Queen-fans and that they really love singing these songs.

The cast and crew are made up by very talented people from Norway, our neighboring Sweden and The UK. Many of them (Including Mari Haugen Smistad, Daniel Engman and Anna Lindgren, the latter playing Khashoggi and Ozzy respectivley) came to the Norwegian production of WWRY straight after closing down the Swedish production just before Christmas. This meaning that the production is pervaded with lots of WWRY-



MOST rock fans would sell their souls to meet Queen guitarist Brian May – but one young fan has actually realised his dream thanks to a charity.

The bouffant-haired legend made sure Connor Walker had the day of his life when he invited the 13-year- old from Kingsbridge, Devon, to jam with him.

The event came to pass thanks to the Make-A-Wish Foundation UK, the charity that grants wishes to children and young people fighting life-threatening illnesses.

Connor has neurofibromatosis, a rare genetic disorder that causes nerve tissue to grow tumours, resulting in Connor having endured more than 18 operations.

Connor is a "massive" Queen fan and to meet the band's famous guitarist was a long-held wish.

The teenager, with his mother Tammie, grandmother Natalie and sister Sophie, had lunch at London's Hard Rock Cafe before being chauffeured to the star's home.

Connor took along his guitar, which Brian signed and tuned, before giving the family a personal tour of his garden. Back inside, two electric guitars were set up — one for Brian and one for Connor.

After an hour's jamming session and some one-on-one tuition on different tunes and chords, Connor emerged beaming, saying it was "the best day of my life".

"When I walked into his house and saw the two guitars set up, I was hoping one would be for me to play but didn't want to presume, so it made me so happy, "he said.


Save The Fan Club Single







at was March 18th 2011 when I made my weekly round on the web unconsciously, wandering through my favourite auction sites, typing Brian May in the search engine; anything special for sale at the moment?

Yes! Two tickets for the Eddy Christiani guitarist award. with Brian May in Vlissingen, The Netherlands, $23^{\rm rd}$ of April. (Never heard of it but after googling a bit: a yearly event where a very well respected electric guitar player receives an award) I quickly rang the ticket service and luckily got an option for the last two tickets. I asked if they knew if Brian was going to play. I mean, driving 700 kms. just for seeing my all time guitar hero for a minute saying thank you and goodbye would be a bit too much Anorak land maybe... Although...

The ticket service didn't have an answer to my question and suggested I contact the organizer of the event. I got his telephone number and called, asking him the same question. His answer was: 'I'd really like to tell you, but Brians management told us he decides about 24 hours prior the show if he'll play or not'. The organizer and I ended up having a very friendly conversation about Brian May. When I told him about my hobby and the gear I have, he said: "You know what? Promise me you come down with your complete guitar set-up. This might make the chance that Brian will play a lot bigger! I'll take care of a hotel for you, fuel costs, meals and a backstage-pass". Sounded like a great deal, so I agreed.

Friday April 22nd

I borrowed my neighbours stationwagen (my car isn't big enough), packed it with some clothes, my upgraded KZ jnr. Red special, 3 Vox AC30's, all my FX's and cables, some spare valves and strings and drove from the North to the south of the country, headed for one of my ultimate dreams: 'Meeting my all time guitar hero Brian May', and who knows, maybe he'll pick up my guitar and... I arrived late at the theatre, where I was able to store my amps and cases for the night.

Saturday April 23rd

THE day had come. I arrived at the theatre at 11am to build up my rig. Van Velzen were due at 12am, and they needed their time to do their soundcheck.

During the build up, Ruben came in. I had never met him before but invited him through the Red Special forum, as I was allowed to take a guest. I had asked him to bring his BMG Red special along, so we would have a spare guitar, in case Brian broke a string on mine!

Through the day we met quite some famous Dutch Rock

and roll guitarists and singers who were going to play and sing at the ceremony. The most famous amongst them accross our country borders was probably Jan Akkerman. By the end of the afternoon one of the organizers came towards me and whispered in my ear: 'within half an hour, we get *a visitor*. Make sure you stay around and don't tell anyone outside'. The row of fans with tickets began to get long in front of the Arsenaal theatre. They were unaware

that Brian was due any moment. He had been told there would be a guitar and set-up for him at the theatre, and so came by there straight from the airport, to check personally if the gear was OK for him.

Half an hour later the organizer girl came back to me, saying: 'you must come with me now'. I went into the hall, where only the organizers and the bandmembers of 'Van Velzen' were left. Everybody else with a backstage pass (famous musicians, roadies, etc. had to leave.) We gathered backstage and it seemed as though everyone was a little nervous! The door opened and some security guys walked through, followed by Brian with his PA Claire. Wow, I never got this close! We all introduced ourselves to him and he thanked me personally for the fact I brought all my (his!) gear for him. It was an honour to bring it along!

Inside the hall he discussed with the organizers what the plans of the night were and he discussed with Van Velzen to play: Don't stop me now, a Brighton rock delay solo and Tie your mother down together that night.

Then we got on stage and I gave Brian my guitar (I already made the strap A LOT longer the night before as I'm a lot smaller than Brian. It seemed the perfect size for him now). I got the feeling he thought it was very funny when he spotted the pic-clip, leather slide holder and the red Grolsch rings. I asked him: 'does it look a bit familiar?' He said: 'Oh my God, it does!'

I switched on all amps (prayed to God they wouldn't fail), plugged in the guitar and Brian started playing, while he walked around the stage with that concentrated look which I only knew from backstage DVD footage. Than he asked

me: 'Hmmm, could you add a bit of gain?' So I unplugged the Fryer touring treble booster and plugged into the Deluxe version. Brian dialed the guitar volume all the way up again and was happy. There was the feedback he wanted (amps were attenuated a tiny bit with my power soaks). I explained him my pedal board and the various switches and programmed FX's so he could switch to whatever setting he wanted tonight: 'his' chorus, brighton rock delay

so I passed him a set of Optima Brian May strings. Brian said he would like the guitar back again later on to play on it for a while before the show.

I was surprised how comfortable I felt, talking to Brian. He really is such a modest and friendly guy. There is absolutely no arrogant rock-star attitude whatsoever!

After everyone had eaten, we walked back to the theatre and passed the long row of visitors. Because of my back-

stage pass we could get straight in again at the side. Inside, just behind the front door, there was a lane of people already formed, all waiting for Brian to come in. Ruben and I waited there for like half an hour too and met quite a few Red special anoraks who knew me from the internet forum or bought a Vox amp of me years ago. Small world!

Then the Dutch artists and finally Brian came in *officially* for the first time.

The show began. Various Dutch artists performed: their own music and a few Queen songs. After that Brian received his award on stage and had a beautiful modest speech. On a big screen on stage Steve Lukather (guitarist of Toto and last years award winner) congratulated Brian in a very nice way as Steve and Brian are good friends.

Brian went off and Van Velzen started their set with 'Save me'. I already heard him doing that during midday with the soundcheck, and he's a great singer. His voice suits Queen songs very well! Jacques and I agreed before the show on what time I had to be stand-by so half way through the show I left Ruben, Daan and his girlfriend, stepped out of the audience and walked through security back stage, looking for Brian and my rig. When I found them at the side of the stage, Brian already had my guitar around his neck and he was silently playing along 'Don't stop me now', which Van Velzen already started. I think he was practising as Van Velzen played in another key than Queen. In the after-

and silent tuner. He was happy with the guitar and decided he definitely wanted to play tonight. Wow! He grabbed Ruben's BMG for a few minutes too.

Just before Brian seemed to be done checking the rig, he strongly(!) pulled all seperate strings of my KZ. The D-string snapped! He said to me he was very sorry, but I was very happy he did that. I would have felt miserable if the string would have snapped after playing just a few notes during the show tonight!

Jacques, a famous Dutch guitar builder and sort of Brian May guitar tech with me for the night had his guitar shop around the corner and promised Brian to put a new one on,

noon they agreed Brian would come on at the start of the solo. During the second verse I tapped on Brians shoulder, saying my favourite expression Brian once did in the past: 'deafen them and blind them'. He laughed and said to me: 'I'll try. Thanx again'.

A few seconds later Brian walked upon stage and the audience went crazy! They had only moments earlier realised Brian would be playing! I will never forget the following 20 minutes. Brian played the second half of Don't stop me now. Van Velzen left the stage after that and I saw Brian tapping my delay switch as I stood only two metres away, right behind the curtain, next to my amps. Brian kept on going playing a Brighton rock solo and seemed to enjoy, just as the audience. After 10 minutes he looked behind him and shouted laughing: 'come back boys!' Van Velzen came back on and together they played Tie your mother



down. My guitar got a premium workout during this classic rock song and I just stood there with very mixed feelings: I was f@&#ing proud he played through my stuff, I realized one of my dreams I've had for 20 years had just come true and at the same time I was scared to death something in my set-up would fail during his playing. The night before I practised in my head a lot of times what to do in different situations once an amp or pedal would go down, so Brian would only loose his sound for a split second in my nightmare scenario, but we both were 'in the lap of the Gods' this night. The sound was amazing and 100% more Brian than when I play through it!

After the short performance (although by far my favourite of all I've ever been to!) Brian went off and went straight to his dressing room. Van Velzen played Somebody to love

beautifully with a gospel choir and I waited outside Brians dressing room, on a few metres distance. The door was open, so I saw Brian and my guitar in that room, together with security and his PA. Only a few minutes later they took off to cool down outside at the back of the theatre as it was hot inside. My dream had come true, so I decided straight-away not to call his name or go after him for an autograph or whatever. I think he probably wouldn't have liked that, that short after the show. I went in to get my guitar. I'm a very gentle player myself, but jeez, there were a lot of scratches on the scratchplate now! I didn't care at all because there's one man in the world besides me who is allowed to make scratches on my guitar...

I put the guitar back into the case again, keeping the two sixpences which Brian had used close to me We all said goodbye after a while and I thanked as much of the organ-

> izing people as I could find in the foyer. The manager of BlØf (another famous Dutch rock band) offered me free tickets when his band will gig in my home town soon. Thanx!

> I took my guitar case back to the hotel around 2 pm, fell exhausted onto the bed, enjoyed the pics I made during the day and fell asleep. Didn't sleep well again...

Sunday April 24th

I woke up dead tired, but decided to get out early. I drove back to the theatre. There were just a few people inside

cleaning the place and I got permission to open up the door at the back of the theatre to pack the car again, and then drove home. My wife and daughter were staying in a holiday house at the beach, so I came in alone and started unpacking the car. After that I knew I wouldn't be able to sleep again somehow. I first needed to write this whole dream down, which I just did for the last three hours.

Brian May, Roel van Velzen, your band and team, Cor, Cindy and Jacques, if you guys ever read this, many, many thanx for making my dream come true! I will never forget your generosity and hospitality. You guys made me feel very welcome!

Ruben, Daan and your girlfriend, thank you so much too for the good time we had together. You guys truly expressed you were happy for me. That touched me!

A dream came true

A dream came true for me on Sunday, and I just wanted to share it with you...

his story begins in February of this year. I was looking on the Nottingham Royal Centre website and just happened to notice that the Anthems tour, featuring Brian May, was to play a night in my hometown. A ticket was booked straight away. I awaited the concert with eager anticipation.

The next part of this story forwards to the 5th March, where I was privileged to be

in attendance at Sir Patrick Moore's 88th birthday celebrations. I've known Sir Patrick since 2008 and, since then, he has become a wonderful family friend (http://www.ciaranbrown.com/patrickmoore.html). Whilst at the party, and in the days previous, it did cross my mind if Brian would be in attendance. I didn't get my hopes up, though, as there was every chance he wouldn't be there. After about an hour of socialising, however, Mr. May walked into the tent. A few minutes later, my father called me over - he was walking in our direction. As he walked past my father and me, I briefly managed to say hello and shake his hand. Even though it was only for a few seconds, it was a big moment in my life. Sadly, we had to leave not long after that, due to the fact that I was taking a LAMDA exam in Nottingham the next morning.

In early April, my mother wrote a letter to Brian May, asking if I could possibly meet him before his show. Kindly asking if he'd forward it on, it was enclosed with a thank you letter that we sent to Sir Patrick.

The final part of this story forwards to the 6th May - only two days before the concert. I was just preparing some dinner (one of my favourite homemade kormas) when the phone rang. I expected it of be one of my friends, not Brian May's secretary! My father and I were told to be at the stage door at 8:00pm, where Brian would happily meet me and sign a few treasured items. I was ECSTATIC!

I woke up on the 8th feeling very, very excited. It still hadn't sunk in that I was going for a personal meeting with my



all-time favourite guitarist. The day went smoothly and my father and I left around 6:45pm. We arrived at the Royal Centre around 7:30pm, which gave me enough time to get myself a souvenir programme. Just before 8:00pm, we both went to the stage door and one of the show crew members showed us, and a few other people, up to a large dressing room.

After five/ten minutes, the unmistakeable Mr. May walked through the door. After another five minutes, he came to chat to me. My father introduced me, to which Brian, in a very warm manner, replied "Hello, Ciaran."

Whilst chatting, we got onto the subject of Sir Patrick Moore. He remembered briefly meeting me, and my father went on to explain about why we left early. We discussed acting, where I was currently studying (Inspire Academy) and that I wanted to attend LAMDA, in London, in the near future. I then added that I'd earned a 'distinction' and couldn't believe it. He held out his hand and said "Put it there, Ciaran." He moved on to sign to two of my books (like Brian, astronomy and photography are of great interest to me), BANG and A Village Lost and Found, as well as my favourite Queen album Hot Space. Whilst handing him my album, I told him that it was my favourite, to which he replied "Ah, interesting."

Before saying our farewells, in order to take my seat for the concert, he posed for a couple of photos.

All in all, it was an MAGICAL experience - one I'll never forget! The concert was INCREDIBLE, too!


